Safety

Safety precautions must be taken to ensure that people and equipment are not damaged. These guidelines are here for those reasons.

1. Nobody sets up or starts the generator, except the **Lead Power Ranger**.
 - a. Mistakes can cause severe damage to the entire system and we could be without power if a serious problem occurred. This happened in '07, so it can happen!
2. Nobody makes any adjustments or changes to the generator, except the Lead Power Rangers or Senior Power Rangers.
3. You must have a 3 prong (5-15/20) power cables and connections on your appliances for safety. Refer to Extension Cords Info Page.
4. Get help from a genuine Power Ranger if additional spider boxes need to be connected.
5. No more than 2 Spider Boxes should be connected to a Distribution outlet.



Outages

There may be outages for rebalancing or repairs-especially in the first couple of days. There is no need to shutdown for refueling, so once live, we plan to keep it running 7x24.

Rain

If it does rain, more than a mist, we may likely shut down the generator for safety reasons. The time frame for the shutdown will depend on the weather conditions. You must be especially careful about touching your electrical connections while on a wet surface (duh!). Safety is our first concern, so please do not take a chance.



What do I do when I lose power?

Try to be patient if you lose power. Find your pod's Power Ranger. The outage may simply be due to re-balancing.

Tent

If you are a single tent and use a single extension cord, the outage may be very simple. Your cord may have been disconnected. You may have popped the GFCI by turning on an appliance that drew a lot of power.

- Follow your cord, or find it's label, ensure it's still plugged in. If unplugged, DO NOT plug it back in yourself. Find a Power Ranger and ask for assistance.
- Check the GFCI. You can attempt to Reset the GFCI by pressing the Reset button. The GFCI should appear "lit" with a green indicator when it is working properly.

- If you still need assistance, find a Power Ranger.

SuperTent

Check your larger appliances. Air Conditioners often have a built in GFCI. This may need to be reset first. After you have checked locally, take the following steps.

- Follow your cord, or find it's label, ensure that your cord is still plugged in. If you find it unplugged, DO NOT plug it back in yourself. Find a Power Ranger for assistance.
- Check the GFCI. You can attempt to Reset the GFCI by pressing the Reset button. The GFCI should appear "lit" with a green indicator when working properly.
- If you still need assistance, find a Power Ranger.

Recreational Vehicle (RV)

RV's can have a number of points of failures. Please make sure you understand how your RV works before arriving on playa.

- Check your RV's breaker panel
 - ↳ This is often near the entrance door or near the power tie in
- Some appliances may have plugs and outlets, check these to ensure the appliance is plugged in correctly and seated fully
- Do not attempt to switch to your generator
- Check the connection from your RV to your Extension cord, make sure it is connected and seated well
- Follow your cord, or find it's label, and ensure that your cord is plugged in. If you find it unplugged, DO NOT plug it back in. Find a Power Ranger for assistance.
- Check the GFCI - AC Units and Fridges can sometimes trip the GFCI when powering up. You can attempt to Reset the GFCI by pressing the Reset button. The GFCI should appear "lit" with a green indicator when working properly.
- If you still need assistance, find a power Ranger.
